A. Politz Day School :

Politz Day School is searching for a dynamic and engaging **Modern Orthodox Rabbi and his wife***, to join the efforts of our committed and visionary leadership team, starting in August 2016. By working together, we will provide our students with an outstanding Jewish educational experience, thus enabling them to be successful in today's complex world while being deeply committed to Torah, mitzvot, and Eretz Yisroel.

Rabbi: The Modern Orthodox Rabbi will serve at Politz Day School of Cherry Hill, a Modern Orthodox day school, as a Judaic Teacher, student role model and activities coordinator and in our warm and vibrant South Jersey community. The Rabbi will have strong interpersonal skills and the desire to help a Torah Institution grow and reach its communal potential. He will fulfill an important support role within Politz Day School of Cherry Hill and add vibrancy to the quality of our student life. The Rabbi will:

- Serve as a supplemental Rebbi at Politz on a daily basis from 8:00AM-10:30AM. The candidate will have sound pedagogical skills and will fully engage our students and foster within them a love of learning and Yiddishkeit.
- Run the daily minyanim and once weekly Mishmar class with the express idea of building and maintaining a keshet with our students. He will also serve as a role model and as a student liaison.
- Teach our Torah SheBaal Peh program for our Banot.
- Improve and enhance our in-school programming for Politz students. Establish clubs, creative outlets, inter-school contests and activities to allow for a vibrant student life.
- Build bridges with community students and parents through Shabbat davening at the local shuls.
- Be a visible face of our school to the young families in the greater community to create a bond and responsiveness that will result in greater student matriculation.
- Will serve as an ambassador to communicate the wonderful things that are happening at Politz to community leaders and to attract new students to our school.
- Coordinate and enhance weekly adult learning opportunities for current and potential parents of our school. Classes on topics such as Torah, Halacha, parenting, and life cycle events will also be advertised and open to the community at large. These learning opportunities will serve to draw in potential parents

and community members who will begin to see Politz as an educational provider for the greater community.

- Proactively arrange Shabbatonim including Tisch and programming, trips of various natures, and other such after-school activities for different segments of our student population. These activities will help foster and nurture a sense of ruach and achdut for our students.

Rebbetzin / Mrs.*:

- Serve as a Morah at Politz for our students, with preference given to a Morah of middle school Banot.

B. NCSY:

In addition to the primary teaching and programmatic responsibilities at the Politz Day School of Cherry Hill, the Kohelet Fellow will serve as the face of NCSY in the Cherry Hill West community:

Overall

- Liaison to Atlantic Seaboard NCSY in the Cherry Hill West community
- Responsible for the spiritual growth of teens in the Cherry Hill West area through building relationships

Programmatic Shabbat and Yom Tov

- Host the local Shabbat and Yom Tov Tisch for teens to experience a traditional and inspirational Shabbat experience. This includes twice-monthly Onegs, Shabbat meals, Seudat Shlishit, etc.
- Work with the Politz community to create upgraded Shabbat and Yom Tov experiences including Teen Minyan, Simchat Torah and Shavuot programs

Other Programmatic responsibilities

- Run Latte and Learning program or another similar program on a weekly basis
- Recruit for Monthly Social programs run by Philadelphia/Cherry Hill Chapter
- Responsible for recruiting and supervision of teens from Cherry Hill West at Regional Shabbatonim (4-5 a year), programs and events
- Help recruit local teens to NCSY summer programs

Middle School NCSY Programming

- Create a monthly middle school program featuring Shabbat and Yom Tov experiences and weekday social/fun programs
- Organize one travel Shabbaton for Cherry Hill middle school teens
- Engage and utilize community teen leaders as advisory staff
